## SCHOLARSHIP BACKGROUND AND INFORMATION

The Baillie Gifford Scholarship is open to female students commencing year 1 of the following software engineering degree programmes:

- BSc (Hons) Computer Games Application Development
- BSc (Hons) Computer Games Technology
- BSc (Hons) Computing
- · BSc (Hons) Ethical Hacking
- · BSc (Hons) Cybersecurity

Applications will be selected based on how well the applicant demonstrates how the scholarship can help them achieve their ambitions to work in a software engineering-related career. Other important factors include students who are first in their family to attend university; have overcome challenging circumstances; are from a low-income background and/or are at risk of leaving their studies will benefit from the scholarship.

Four Baillie Gifford STEM scholarships are available in Academic Year 2023/24.

## **ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA**

To be considered for this scholarship, applicants must meet <u>all</u> of the following criteria:

- Be commencing year 1 in one of the following BSc (Hons) degree in September 2022:
  - BSc (Hons) Computer Games Application Development
  - BSc (Hons) Computer Games Technology
  - BSc (Hons) Computing
  - BSc (Hons) Ethical Hacking
  - BSc (Hons) Cybersecurity
- Identify as female.
- Be able to demonstrate a financial need for support in the application form.
- Be able to demonstrate a strong intent to have a career in software engineering when they graduate.
- Be willing to meet the award conditions set out below.

## WHAT KIND OF FUNDING IS AVAILABLE?

A £1,500 scholarship will be awarded to seven successful applicants. The Award will be paid in two instalments.

First instalment: December 2023

Second instalment: April 2024

## **AWARD CONDITIONS**

Applicants must be willing and able to meet the following award conditions if successful:

- 1. To write a Thank You letter addressed to the Award Donor
- 2. To give permission for elements of your Thank You letter to be quoted for promotional materials
- 3. To meet with the Donor at the Donors request
- 4. To take part in promotional activity relating to this Award
- 5. To write an end of year update on your progress at Abertay University

## **APPLICATION DEADLINES**

Applications must be submitted by the deadline with all applicable evidence as outlines within the application form. Incomplete applications will not be considered.

Deadline: Thursday 30th November 2023

HOW CAN I APPLY? Applications may be downloaded and completed on a device or printed and completed by hand. A typed signature may be accepted where the application has been completed electronically.

Applications must be submitted with the supporting evidence detailed in the application form.

## **APPLICATION SUBMISSION**

Completed applications and evidence should be submitted to **the Advisory Service by email** from your student email address or university registered personal email address if you are not yet a registered student.
